KATE LAMPARD Chair, Gamble Aware



Kate works as an independent consultant undertaking investigations and advising organisations on management and service effectiveness and development.

She led the NHS investigations into Jimmy Savile, and produced a report for the Secretary of State for Health setting out the lessons for today's health service. She was commissioned by the board of Serco Plc to investigate the treatment of residents at Yarl's Wood Immigration Removal Centre. Previously Kate spent 13 years as a practising barrister before moving into the public sector where she held a number of non-executive appointments.

Kate has been the chair of the South East Coast Strategic Health Authority, vice chair of the South of England Strategic Health Authority and a non-executive director and vice chair of the Financial Ombudsman Service Limited. She acted as interim chair of the Independent Advisory Panel on Deaths in Custody. Kate is the lead non-executive director on the Department of Health Board as well as being a trustee of the Esmée Fairbairn Foundation and the Royal Horticultural Society. Kate was appointed Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) in the 2015 New Year Honours for services to the National Health Service and to the community in Kent.

PROFESSOR ALAN EMOND Emeritus Professor of **Community Child Health, University of Bristol**

Alan is a clinical academic paediatrician who is Emeritus Professor of Community Child Health at the University of Bristol. He completed 40 years of clinical NHS practice in general, developmental and community paediatrics when he retired in 2018. He has extensive research experience in epidemiology and health service evaluation, was involved in the founding of the Avon Longitudinal Study of Parents and Children (ALSPAC - Children of the Nineties) and has published on a wide range of paediatric topics using this cohort. He led the ALSPAC Gambling study. investigating gambling in youth between 17 and 24 years.

Henrietta is the Founder and Director of the National Problem Gambling Clinic in the UK, the first NHS service in the UK designated to the treatment of Gambling Disorder. She is spokesperson on Behavioural Addictions for the Royal College of Psychiatrists and Honorary Clinical Senior Lecturer at Imperial College as well as being the current President of the Medical Women's Federation. She was made an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) at Buckingham Palace in the 2019 New Year's Honours for Services to Addiction Treatment and to Research.
